










Objective: To make the site more readable, logically organized, easy to use, and visually delightful



What are you trying to achieve?

- Improve readability of definition pages

Must-haves:

- Improved information hierarchy in universal navigation bar
- Revitalized visual identity
- Clearer, more prominent options for navigating long definitions
- Clearer calls-to-action and information for prospective subscribers

What problems are you solving?

- Visual aesthetic is dated and boring
- conflicting navigation bars
- Subscription options are not displayed prominently

- Update overall aesthetic in favour of a modern, sleek approach - Reorganize information to better prioritize key user tasks - Visually prioritize subscriptions as a key business goal

- Information on the home page is not presented effectively/clearly - Definition pages are difficult to navigate due to lengthy walls of text and multiple






